DOWNTOWN DEAUVILLE

Deauville is a upmarket resort initially founded and developed in the 19th century, it was in the early 20th century that the second wave of development took place, including the renowned boardwalk along the coast, the sophisticated casino, and the grand hotels. More recently Deauville has gained a reputation for its international film festivals. You will find designer shops and glitzy hotels. There are lots of seafood restaurants along the waterfront. The promenade along the 1.5km long boardwalk is a highlight of your visit, as is (if you are up in time) watching the racehorses training on the beach first thing in the morning.
